# HSPD-12 Goals and Major Accomplishments

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## **Goals:**

- Improve security
- Bring together physical security, information security, and human resources
- Apply a consistent, risk-based approach to physical and information systems security

## **Major Accomplishments to date:**

- As of October 2005, all employees and contractors required to undergo background checks
- FIPS 201 standard developed (within 6 months)
- HSPD-12 system deployment phase has begun
- Increased coordination within federal government



## HSPD-12 Implementation Schedule

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<b>Date</b>	<b>Federal Agency Actions</b>
10/27/05	Comply with FIPS 201, Part 1
10/27/06	Begin compliance with FIPS 201, Part 2
10/27/07	Verify and/or complete background investigations
10/27/08	Complete background investigations for all Federal department or agency employees employed over 15 years



## What are the expectations for October 27, 2006?

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In support of the October 27, 2006 deadline, OMB is requesting agencies to:

1. Have a capability in place to begin issuing PIV compliant cards by October 27, 2006
2. Have an updated Implementation Plan, by September 8, 2006, for full compliance with PIV-2, FIPS 201-1
3. Continue to employ the approved agency PIV-1 process to process personnel
4. Implement physical and logical access control systems according to their OMB agreed upon Implementation Plan
5. Use GSA approved products and services for all new purchases in accordance with OMB Memorandum 05-24
6. Identify sites that will be participating in the government-wide shared services solution

**We need industry support to make this happen!**



## Recent Accomplishments

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- OMB acquisition guidance issued on June 30
- Government Certified and Approved Services and Products Listing established in June
- GSA Managed Services Office established and Shared Services MOU provided to agencies
- Shared Services Cost Model and Fee Structure released
- Multiple RFPs issued and contracts awarded



## What needs to be done so agencies can meet the deadline?

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- Need industry support so GSA can continue to increase the number of products on the Approved Products List
  - Ongoing
- Deploy Initial Phase of Shared Services Operating Capability
  - September/October 2006: to support agencies participating in government-wide implementation approach



## What's Next?

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- The HSPD-12 Executive Steering Committee will continue to provide recommendations and focus on ensuring interoperability across the federal government
- GSA will assist agencies, as necessary, by providing for aggregate buys of physical and logical access control systems
